

3.3.4 ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

1. The SR-710 Study Project EIR/EIS process has failed to properly identify issues, environmental impacts, or impact mitigations related to Disadvantaged Communities in the Study Area, and has both failed to inform and misinformed these communities in a manner that perpetuates environmental injustice.

The WPRA findings on the subject of EJ are provided in a memo shown as Attachment A: 'Environmental Justice Comments for the SR-710 Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) / Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)', from Roger Kintz to the WPRA, August 2, 2015.

2. The WPRA adopts and incorporates the EJ-related findings submitted by the Coalition for a Safe Environment (CFASE).
